## Major Olympic Moments Project

Your assignment is to research one of the Major Olympic Moment in sports history and create a PowerPoint/Slides about your topic. You may choose any of the major moments from the list below. Make sure your presentation includes all the required elements and that the presentation is visually appealing, including pictures, and is organized/effective at delivering key information about your Olympic moment. The project is worth **40** points total. Below is a list of the required elements to include in your PowerPoint.

- **Background to the Olympic Games:** What was the build-up to the event? How was society or politics before the Olympics? Brief overview of the Olympics: Where When, Who, etc.
  - a. Your background section should be detailed! You need to set the stage for why the famous Olympic moment happened! This means that you need to do extensive research to present this in an effective and concise manner. None of these events “just happened”.
- **Description and Analysis of the Event/Moment:** What directly caused the event to happen? What happened in the Moment/Event? What was the aftermath of the even/moment?
- **Social or Political Impact of the Event:** What larger social/political issues were brought to light by this event? Did it have lasting impacts; make large changes or what is short-lived? Did it have direct impacts on the Olympics? On society? On politics? How was the event received by the global audience?
- **Video of the Event & Extra Information:** Any information that is relevant/prevalent to the event/moment, but does not fit into other categories. Videos must be between 0:30-2 minutes in length. Questions? Email me!
- **Works Cited Slide:** All citations should be done in MLA format. You should use online citation makers if you are unsure how to cite websites in MLA format.

You must email me your presentation by 5pm May 1, 2020. The rubric for the project can be found on the next page as well as a suggested project schedule.
