## **Professional Sports Group Project**

Your assignment is to research your assigned professional sport and history as a group and create a digital presentation (PowerPoint, Prezi, Slides, etc.) to teach your fellow classmates about your topic. Make sure your presentation includes all the required elements and that your presentation is 8-12 minutes. Each group member must contribute equally to the project and is responsible for specific topics related to the project. Individual as well as group grades will be given for different elements of the project. The project is worth 70 points total. Below is a list of the required elements to include in your presentation.

- 1. **General overview of your assigned professional sport**. This includes basic rules, type of field/surface the sport is played on, length of games/matches, length of season, number of games, etc.
- 2. **Structure of the organization**. What is the breakdown of the leagues, divisions, teams, etc? Explain scoring, player/team rankings, tournament/playoff structure and schedule. What is the top prize?
- 3. **History of the organization/sport.** Include when it was created, how it was created, at least 5 major moments in the history of the sport, 3 important players/coaches (biographies & their impact on the game)
- 4. **Current events or issues affecting the organization or sport.** Include information on controversies, rule changes, disputes, economics, politics, and society within the organization.

You must present this information in front of the class and all group members must help to present the information. You will have 2 (1 regular + 1 Block) work days in class and your project is due Thursday, February 27, 2020. Presentations will begin that day.
